- Basic Viewpoints for Logistics Management and Improvement -

BACKGROUND

The Association for Overseas Technical Cooperation and Sustainable Partnerships (AOTS) is an organization for human resources development mainly in overseas countries to promote technical cooperation through training, experts dispatch and other programs. Through those programs, we aim at contributing to the mutual economic growth of developing countries and Japan as well as enhancing friendly relations among those countries. The AOTS webinar "Logistics Management for African Companies –Basic Viewpoints for Logistics Management and Improvement-" (KRAF01) is an online seminar (webinar) organized and conducted by AOTS in cooperation with the African Federation of AOTS Alumni Societies (AFAAS).

Challenges of logistics in Africa have been identified as we observe various problems caused by the spread of COVID-19. However, more eyes are on logistics in Africa. In the long run, quality and quantity of logistic services in the region are expected to grow.

This webinar targets owners, executives, senior managers and engineers involved in logistics of their own companies and organizations in Africa. Participants will deepen their understanding of the viewpoints of logistics management and improvement, and thereby be able to improve logistics management of their own companies and organizations.

OUTLINE

This webinar is designed to help the participants with a variety of backgrounds to learn more about the basic concepts of supply chains and logistics management. Our goal is to have them acquire capacity to find the problems that need to be addressed, countermeasures and improvement perspectives thereof. The lecturer has a long year experience in consultation of logistics in Japanese companies. He will introduce the practices of Japanese companies, while taking up the problems facing the participants' own companies and organizations. The program structure allows the participants to consider how to reconstruct and optimize each function of logistics and solve their problems.

OBJECTIVES

This webinar aims to help company owners, executives, and middle and senior managers and engineers involved in logistics at their companies / organizations to achieve the following objectives.

- 1) To understand the impact and issues of the COVID-19 pandemic on the supply chain and logistics management of companies
- 2) To understand the concept of logistics (transportation and delivery, cargo handling and storage, logistics cost, quality control, network design, etc.)
- 3) To understand the case example of Japanese companies
- 4) To understand how to identify issues in logistics management and how to optimize them.

[Basic Requirements for Participants]

In order to participate in the training program, the following conditions must be satisfied, in addition to the work experience and position requirements specified for each program.

- a) Participants should live and work in target countries. Japanese is NOT applicable.
- b) Participants should belong to either corporation or organization.
- c) Participants should be 20 years old and over.
- d) Participants should have enough English language ability so as to be able to understand the program content.
- e) Participants should not be armed forces personnel.

Notes:

- 1) In the case of applications from other than Japanese-affiliated companies or local companies that hold local capital, the priority for selection becomes lower.
- 2) This training is mainly aimed at the people working in the companies/organizations in the private sector, so those who belong to national or local government agencies are not eligible to participate.
